Hôtel Le Place d'Armes

Hotel and restaurant in town. Le Place d'Armes is a charming hotel on the place d'Armes, the historic heart of Luxembourg, a meeting place in summer and winter, close to the "Cercle Cité", the business and pedestrian shopping district. Past and present are perfectly balanced in the 18th century building, which skillfully blends Art nouveau, a revisited Baroque and contemporary styles. Each of the guest rooms and suites is decorated in a delicate colour palette and has its own style and charm. The gourmet restaurant La Cristallerie focuses on exceptional products and the Plëss has the charming atmosphere of a chic brasserie, whilst the renowned Café de Paris is marked by a bistro atmosphere.

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Villa Pétrusse

At the foot of the Old City of Luxembourg, encircled by grounds more than a century old crafted by celebrated landscape designer Edouard André, Villa Pétrusse has made its home in a private residence, an architectural jewel that is emblematic of the city's late-19th-century transformation. Travel back in time in the refined elegance and old-world charm of a property that exudes the subtle, unostentatious warmth of a well-appointed family home inhabited by discerning art lovers. The room décor includes reproductions of watercolors by illustrious Luxembourgish painter Sosthène Weis; all have a breathtaking view of the grounds and the adjacent Pétrusse, the river for which the hotel is named. This subtle combination of past and present that defines the Villa's atmosphere also serves to inspire Kim de Dood, chef at the gourmet restaurant Le Lys, serving traditional Luxembourgish cuisine tinged with Asian influences and inspired by the seasons.

Le Domaine de la Klauss

Hotel and restaurant in a village. Wake up in a stunning natural setting in the Lorraine countryside.
