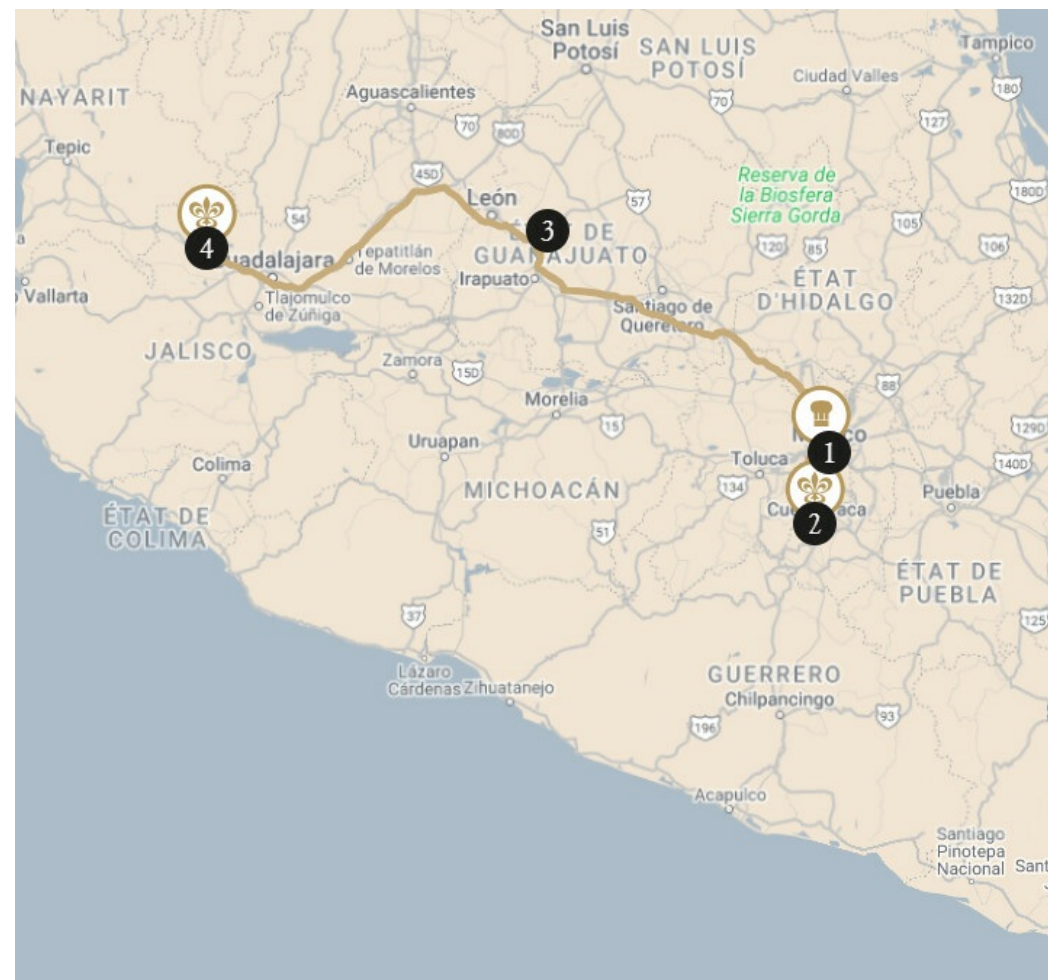




ROUTES DU BONHEUR Journey into Deepest Mexico

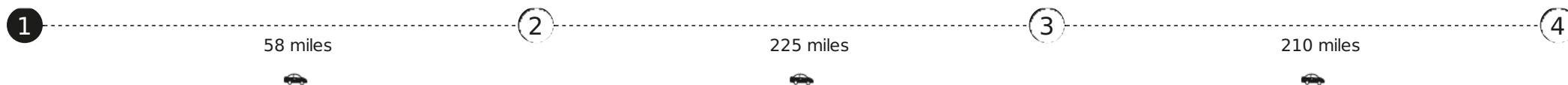

1 MEXICO CITY — 1 NIGHT

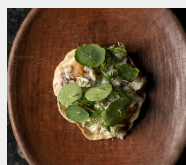

As both a modern city named the world capital of design in 2018, and the cradle of Aztec civilizations, Mexico City leaves visitors fascinated by its magnetic charm. The Mexican megalopolis offers a journey through seven centuries of history. From Teotihuacan, the pre-Columbian city-state with contemporary art galleries, and El Zocalo, the epicenter of the historic colonial part of town, to the hip neighborhood of Roma, the Mexican capital has the largest number of museums in the world, and boasts no less than 6 UNESCO World Heritage Sites.

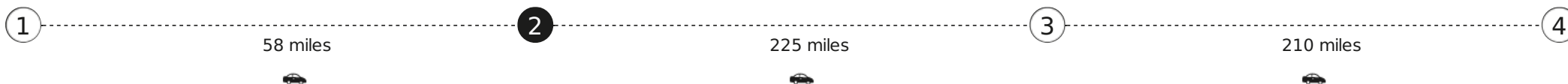

2 CUERNAVACA — 2 NIGHTS

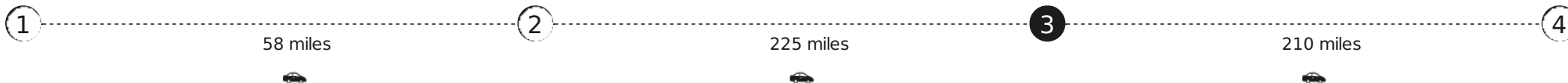

Hotel Las Mañanitas

Hotel and restaurant in town. This sumptuous, authentic Mexican hacienda is located in the center of Cuernavaca, the “city of eternal spring.” In the exotic gardens, among the sculptures by Francisco Zúñiga and lush flowers, elegant peacocks strut about and blue parrots perch in the trees. The colonial suites, in their tiled-roof villas, are decorated with beautiful antiques and artworks, including paintings by José Luis Cuevas, Leonardo Nierman and Carlos Mérida. In addition to generous servings of traditional cuisine, Las Mañanitas offers a choice of excursions on the Aztec trail, with visits to the Palace of Cortés and the ruined cities of Xochicalco and Taxco, famous for its silversmiths.



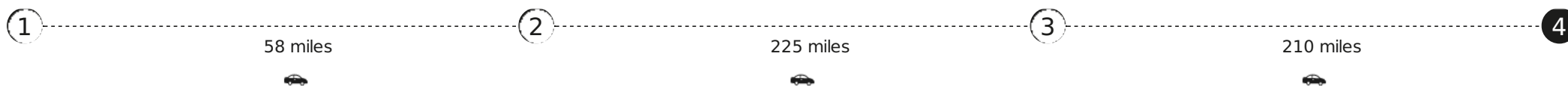

3 GUANAJUATO — 1 NIGHT

Located at over 6,500 feet above sea level, Guanajuato is known as the "pearl of the colonial cities". Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1988, the former mining town boasts impressive colonial-style residences, beautiful churches, and pastel-colored houses. Guanajuato is now a bustling university city, where the famous International Cervantino Festival dedicated to theatre, music and dance takes place every autumn.



4 TEQUILA — 2 NIGHTS

Hotel Solar de las Animas

Hotel and restaurant in town. Agave fields at the foot of a volcano, a colourful little town, you are in the cradle of the most famous Mexican beverage, in Tequila. The entire soul of Mexico is present here, in the vast architecture inspired by the colonial estates of El Solar de Las Ánimas, its arcades, corridors, ceramics and patios; in the fresh and organic produce of a fine local cuisine; in the paintings of Chucho Reyes which adorn the bar. Go for a visit to the distillery, the pre-Hispanic site of Guachimontones, ride a horse or do abseiling in the canyons ... the bells of Santiago Apostol will ring when the sun goes down, for a cocktail on the terrace, of course based on tequila.
